Dear Jeweled Fountain Students.

Your femininity is created to be like the beautiful fountain on the cover of this manual—many-tiered, graceful in shape, and flowing with sparkling water! God wants you to be just such a vessel, bejeweled, and pouring forth water that sparkles in the sunlight of God's love.

This Bible study has been written to help you understand who God created you to be. As you learn to know and obey God, He will enable you to fulfill the high and lovely purposes that He has for you now as a girl and later as a woman.

Let me explain the basic organization of our study. Our study is organized around the concept of a fountain with five tiers. The fountain that is you is represented by the fountain on the cover and by the line drawing on the inside cover.

A. The Image of The Jeweled Fountain

- 1. The base and the center of the fountain represent your image of God. This is your core personhood.
- 2. The water of the fountain represents your salvation given by Christ in the Holy Spirit. The Spirit of God flows through your created and redeemed being to give life, love, and glory to God and to all those whose lives you touch.
- 3. The five tiers represent aspects of your femininity. Just as our fountain has five tiers, our study will cover five facets or aspects of femininity. These tiers are based on specific things that God has said about the nature and identity of woman in the Bible. The colors of the pages are matched in each unit to the aspect being covered.
- 4. The fountain jewels represent virtues fundamental to each feminine aspect. Upon completion of each unit, the appropriate tier is decorated, and the "virtue jewels" are added.
- B. Each tier of the fountain (or aspect) is covered in a unit of five lessons:
 - The first two lessons explain how and why God designed this part of your femininity.
 - The third lesson explains how sin and the curse have shattered this aspect.
 - The fourth lesson explains how Christ restores what has been destroyed.
 - The fifth lesson, called a Life Lesson, is your opportunity to review and apply the unit.

C. Recording Your Work

Your learning and memory work will be recorded with the help of three other images: Treasure Truths, the Open Bible, and the Treasure Chest of Your Heart. You will fill in and decorate these images as you complete the course.

• 40 Treasure Truths (index, pages 247-251):

The Bible is full of countless truths, insights, and commandments. Each lesson highlights two or three truths that you should treasure and live by as you grow into a mature woman of God. You will list these truths as you learn them on your "Open Bible" pages 264-265.

• Memory Verses to Hide in the Heart

Memory verses are provided for every lesson and virtue. You may record your progress in memorization by writing the Scripture references on page 266 and by placing jewels on 267.

D. Glossary

The Jeweled Fountain has a rather large word list in the back (pages 253-263). Use and enjoy it! It is full of words which will help you understand God, His work, and His plan for you!

One more thing—I was once a girl just your age. Wise women at my church helped me learn God's Word and encouraged me in godly femininity. For my part, I would like to dedicate this manual to one of these women.

The Jeweled Fountain is dedicated to Mrs. La Verne Henley, Director of Girls' Auxiliary at First Baptist Church, Waxahachie, Texas, 1958-1966.

As a faithful Lady of Wisdom, she emphasized the memorization of Scripture and the importance of feminine godliness for many young girls.

Life's big questions

Do you ever ask serious questions about your life? The deepest and most mysterious questions that have puzzled people since the beginning of time are questions like:

- "Who am I?"
- "Where did I come from?"
- "Why am I here?"

You are at an age when you will begin to ponder this kind of question. You might talk about questions like this with your family and close friends. As a girl, you will also be wondering, "Why are there males and females?" "What is a girl?" and "What is the meaning of femininity?"

ALL OF THE ABOVE people and places can give answers to these questions! The problem is that their answers differ from one another! How do you know who has the right and good answers to life's big questions?

How do I choose my authority?

Have you ever heard the expression, "When all else fails, read the instructions"? Who provides instructions for the use of a product? You guessed it, the person who designed the product is the best person to give instructions.

In the first two lessons about Daughter of the King, we will look at God's perfect design for you. To find out how He answers the big questions we have about life, we must turn to His instruction manual,

In Genesis, the first book of the Bible, God has recorded how He went about creating the world. We will look at verses 26, 27, and 28, of Genesis chapter 1. These verses give the first account of the creation of man and woman on day six of creation. Let's read the passage:

the Bible.



∬ Genesis 1:26-28

²⁶Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth. ²⁷" So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. ²⁸And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living that moves on the earth."

What's an image?

The following words or phrases in Genesis 1:26-28 are all important for understanding our identity and purpose: image, female, male, fruitful, image of God, subdue, earth. Right now, we will just consider the first word: "image."



image: a model, likeness, replica, or representation: Example: The statue was the image of a girl, the stuffed toy was in the image of a bear.

What you see in the mirror is not you, but a reflection of you. The Liberty Bell represents the ideals of liberty and freedom, etc. Can you see that an "image" is not the thing itself, but a representation of the original?

Men and women, boys and girls, are all people or persons. As persons, we are all made in the "image," or likeness of God, The Original Person! (This does NOT mean that we are all little gods!) This DOES mean that we have minds (we think), wills (we choose), and emotions (we feel). We are like God, the Original Thinker, Chooser, and Feeler.

This truth from Genesis 1:27 provides us with part of the answer to the "Who am I?" question. Humans are made in the "image of God." You are made in the image of God. You are patterned after Him, like the house in the picture on page 5 is modeled after a lifesize house.

Doesn't this make you want to find out more about God? The more you can find out about God's specific characteristics, the more you will know about yourself and all other human beings. You will find richer and deeper answers to the origin and identity question, "Who am I?"

What's an attribute?

Before we look at a list of God's "attributes," let us look at the definition of the word "attribute."



attribute: a characteristic basic to the nature of the one who possesses it.

Can you see how "attributes" are built into the nature of things? A lemon has a built-in sour taste. So "sour taste" is an attribute of a lemon. A lemon wouldn't be a lemon if it were not sour. You can count on a lemon to be sour! Lemons have always been sour and they always will be sour. Get the idea? Can this information about "lemon attributes" be used to understand something about God's "divine attributes"?

God's divine attributes

God's attributes are specific characteristics that are built in to His very nature. His attributes describe what He is like. We can count on Him to have them. He has always had them and He always will have them. What are some of God's attributes? What are the qualities that He has on which we can rely?

Humans are little copies of God because they are images or "models" of Him. To be more specific, the human attributes (such as mind, will, and conscience) are created as little replicas of God's great attributes (such as His all-knowing mind, His sovereign will, and His all righteous character).

Wrapping Up Lesson 1 about God's Image

Mining truth from God's Word

In each lesson of *The Jeweled Fountain* we will have a wrap-up section like this one in which we highlight the most important truths from that lesson. These teachings will be called Treasure Truths.

This week we have studied:

Treasure Truth #1: The Blessing of God's Image. The answer to the big question "Who am I?" is this: I am a creature in the image of God. I can think, choose, love, and make moral choices because I am a little replica of God. This "imagehood" is the foundation of my worth and value as a person.

Read over Treasure Truth #1 very carefully. Then write the name of Truth #1—**The Blessing of God's Image**—on page 264 to show that you have mined this truth from God's Word. When you complete this course, you will have learned (and listed) 40 precious truths from Scripture which will guide and bless you for the rest of your life!

Hiding treasure in your heart

God's Word is the treasure chest of all truth. When we memorize portions of Scripture we are storing up jewels that last forever. *The Jeweled Fountain* study provides at least one memory verse in the wrap-up section of each lesson. Our memory verse for this lesson is Genesis 1:27.

This verse is such an important verse in the Bible it has its own name. It is called the "World Mandate." What does this mean? A mandate is a command given by a superior to a representative authorizing him to act. You can clearly see that God is the ultimate superior and He has given us human beings the command to rule the whole earth.



World Mandate: God's authoritative command that man and woman rule, subdue, and multiply over the whole earth, as stated in Genesis 1:28. This is God's first and basic command to human beings.

Think of all the things God could have commanded man and woman to do first: love, worship, preach, behave themselves, or invite the angels over for dinner! However, none of these were His first order to mankind. His first command was for them to rule the earth for Him.

Just think, God could have stayed and ruled the earth Himself. Some people say, "If you want something done right, you have to do it yourself." God didn't say that or do that. He created man and woman and they were very good. He gave them all the tools (attributes) they would need to accomplish their jobs. They had minds, will, power, consciences, and they would live forever. God designed them to be His representatives, as creatures fully in His image, and gave them the command and authority to rule the earth. If you look closely, you will spot three basic commands in Genesis 1:28: RULE, SUBDUE, BE FRUITFUL.

What's going on in this world? Why do things get messy, wear out, decay, break, die, and waste away? Does it ever seem as if your "domain" is working against you? You are trying so hard to rule and be productive, but THINGS JUST AREN'T COOPERATING!!! What's happening to God's "very good" design?

True to His loving nature, God has not left us without answers to these questions. Let's look at our Instruction Manual. Genesis 2 and 3 hold the answer to these questions. We will be doing a skit based on these chapters. In preparation, read through the following verses carefully.



Genesis 2: 16-17

¹⁶And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, ¹⁷but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."...



Genesis 3:17-19

¹⁷ Then to Adam He said, "Because you have listened to the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree about which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat from it'; cursed is the ground because of you; in toil you will eat of it all the days of your life. ¹⁸ Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you; and you will eat the plants of the field; ¹⁹ By the sweat of your face you will eat bread, till you return to the ground, because from it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Adam and Eve are the only humans to have experienced God's creation in its "very good" state. It is hard for us to imagine, but they lived in a garden without weeds, without droughts or storms, without harmful insects. Creation tended toward life and fruitfulness, not destruction and death. Food was readily available, just by picking it. Their relationships with one another and with God were perfect. They had the privilege of walking and talking with Him every day. But, with every privilege comes responsibility. Adam and Eve had the responsibility to obey God by not eating of one tree in the garden. They chose to disobey.



Fountain Films: The story of creation in three acts

Act out the story of Creation, the Fall, and the Curse, pantomiming the events and using the dialogue on the following pages. You will need to assign the roles of narrator, God, Adam, the woman, and the serpent for each section. This activity should only take about two minutes for each section.

The point is to understand the sequence of events and the specifics of the words, not to have a Hollywood production.

2. Read the dialogue exactly as given. Resist the "temptation" to use your own words.

Act I: CREATION

Cast: Narrator, God, Adam, woman

NARRATOR

(Actresses can pantomime the action as the narrator describes it.)

- God creates the world in six days.
- On the sixth day, God creates the first man, Adam, from dust.
- God brings Adam to the garden, and tells him:

GOD:

"From any tree in the garden you may eat freely; but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in that day you eat from it you will surely die."

NARRATOR: (Keep pantomiming, every time the narrator describes action.)

• On the sixth day, God creates another person from Adam's side.

• Adam names the person:

ADAM: "she shall be called 'woman,' for she was taken out of man."

NARRATOR: God gives Adam and the woman their jobs:

GOD: "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish of

the sea and the birds of the sky and over every living creature that moves on the

earth."

NARRATOR: God looked at all that He had made and saw that it was...

GOD: "VERY GOOD"

NARRATOR: On the seventh day, God rested.

Act II: THE FALL

Cast: Narrator, serpent, woman, Adam, God

NARRATOR: The crafty serpent approaches the woman and asks:

SERPENT: "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden?"

NARRATOR: The woman misquotes God's words by answering:

WOMAN: "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, but God did say, 'You must not eat

fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or

you will die."

SERPENT: "You will not surely die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be

opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."

NARRATOR: (Are you remembering to act this out?)

• The woman eats the fruit and gives some to Adam, who is with her, and he eats it.

 Adam and the woman realize that they are naked, and they try to cover themselves with clothes they make out of fig leaves.

• God comes walking in the garden, at His usual time.

• Adam and the woman do an unusual thing: they hide from God in fear. God called to

the man:

GOD: "Where are you?"

ADAM: "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid."

GOD: "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree that I commanded

you not to eat from?"

ADAM: "The woman you put here with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it."

GOD: (To the woman) "What is this that you have done?"

WOMAN: "The serpent deceived me, and I ate it."

ACT III: THE CURSE

Cast: Narrator, God, serpent, woman, Adam

NARRATOR: The LORD God said to the serpent,

GOD: "Because you have done this, Cursed are you above all the livestock, and all the wild

animals! You will crawl on your belly and you will eat dust all the days of your life. And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and

hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

NARRATOR: And God said to the woman:

GOD: "I will greatly increase your pain in childbearing; with pain you will give birth to

children. Your desire will be for your husband, and he will rule over you.

NARRATOR: To Adam he said,

GOD: "Because you listened to your wife and ate from the tree about which I commanded

you, 'You must not eat of it,' cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat of it all the days of your life. It will produce thorns and thistles for you, and you will eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are

and to dust you will return."

NARRATOR: Adam named his wife Eve, because she would become the mother of all the living.

The End

In this account in Genesis God gives us the answer to our question, "What is wrong with everything?" At the beginning of time, man and woman rebelled against God the King. Because of that rebellion, all of humanity, this planet, and the whole universe have been changed ever since.

Think back to Lesson 1 and the section entitled "God's divine attributes." Remember God's attribute of justice? He is just, He has always been just, and He always will be just. God told Adam that if Adam ate from the tree he would surely die. Adam ate anyway. In justice, God kept His word, and Adam experienced death.

My image of God is broken

Our very natures are cursed as well! Since the Fall, we still reflect the image of God, but now that image has been corrupted by sin. We have all died spiritually through Adam. Sin separates us from God. Since our spirits cannot live without Him, God was right when He said, "you will surely die."



When Adam fell, the whole world (indeed the universe) fell with Him. Is the opposite true? When mankind is saved, will the whole creation be restored as well? (Consider the picture to the left for a clue and Romans 8:20-21 for the answer.)


Daughters of the King in fame and shame

Video & Movie Hall of Fame - The mother in Swiss Family Robinson used what she had to subdue her domain.






Biblical Hall of Shame - Jezebel ruled with determination and efficiency, but served false gods.

The Daughter of the King Tier of Your Jeweled Fountain

It is time to begin decorating your "Jeweled Fountain." On the inside front of your handbook is a simple drawing of a fountain. This fountain represents you and your femininity as God has created it to be. The "jewels" of your fountain are the virtues that adorn your femininity. Your "virtue verses" are listed below. Memorize and meditate on these verses as you decorate your fountain.

The Jewel of faith

Romans 5:1 Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.



The Jewel of responsibility

2 Corinthians 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil.

The first tier of your fountain on the inside cover represents the Daughter of the King aspect. Only decorate the bottom tier of the fountain this time because it represents the aspect we have studied in this unit. The color for Daughter of the King is yellow. Yellow is the color of the sun in its power. As Daughters of the King, we walk in the light of God our Father and rule our domains with the power He provides. The adorning jewels are obedience and responsibility. There is a list of characteristics and roles for this aspect on page 1 of this lesson.

These colors and ideas can be used to embellish and "illuminate" your fountain. You can use colored pencils, markers, gel pens, mosaics, any type of technique you would like, to place the "jewels" on the bottom tier of your fountain. By the time you have completed this year's course, your fountain (and you!) should be beautifully adorned!
